

What To Expect:

Camp begins Sunday at 11 a.m. for a day of orientation. The camp will be divided into work teams made up of youth and adults from different churches. Each team will head to their worksite each weekday and return to camp in the evening for dinner, fellowship activities, singing and an evening speaker.

Every youth and adult is expected to participate in all activities during the week.

- We sleep in primitive cabins but have very up-to-date bathing and good dining facilities.

- No one will be allowed to work a partial week; this means no one may come to the camp after Sunday or leave before Saturday except in case of emergency.

- Each participant will be asked to sign a community covenant which will be provided upon acceptance to HSP.

- Each group must provide 1 vehicle for each youth they bring (2 vehicles for 6 youth, etc.)

Each vehicle must have the capacity to transport a 6-member work team in seats along with necessary tools and lunch and water coolers.

Highland Service Project June 14-20, 2009

The Highland Service Project (HSP) was established in 1984 by a group of Highland United Methodist Church members dedicated to providing an opportunity for youth and adult volunteers to serve God by serving others. For one week each summer, youth and adults from several churches across North Carolina come together to form a community of workers to make repairs on the homes of needy people of Wake County. The project is sponsored by Highland United Methodist Church in cooperation with Resources for Seniors of Wake County.

Cost: \$125 per participant.

Deposit: \$50 per participant

Location:

The project is based at Camp Lapihio in William B. Umstead State Park in Raleigh, NC. All work sites are in Wake County.

Who May Participate:

- **Youth:** Must be at least 15 years old or rising 10th grader through graduated senior.
- **Adults:** There must be a ratio of 1 adult to every 5 youth (2 adults for 6 youth, etc.) and there must be at least 1 adult per applying group. Adults must be 21 years of age or older. Adults who accompany groups are responsible for the youth they bring and will help provide the leadership for the project as a whole. These adults will serve as work team leaders during the week providing leadership and serving as a Christian role model for the youth. If you have a mixed group, we request that you bring both male and female adults.

Application Procedure:

- The application must be filled out and signed by the entire group and postmarked by March 2, 2009. A \$50 application fee, which will be credited to the final balance due, must accompany the application.
- Notification of acceptance will be made by March 16, 2009.
- Upon acceptance a deposit of \$50 per participant must be postmarked by April 13, 2009. If for any reason a participant must withdraw, his/her deposit may be transferred to another participant, but is not refundable. The balance will be due upon arrival at camp.
- Be accurate and honest in determining the size of your group and the real commitment your group is willing to make to a work camp experience. Important! In the event that we receive applications totaling more than 50 youth, we will request that each of the applying groups accept a reduced group size limit. Our intention is to allow the maximum number of youth groups to experience HSP.
