## **Membership Care and Accountability**

One of the hallmarks of John and Charles Wesley's student days at Oxford University was the establishment of the Holy Clubs. The clubs were opportunities for the students of like Christian virtues to meet and share their struggles, temptations and joys and pray for one another. These early days of the Holy Clubs would lead to small organizations such as bands, societies, and class meetings.

The rules for the bands and societies were drawn up on December 25, 1738. They agreed to meet for several expressed reasons:

- 1. To meet once a week, at least.
- 2. To come punctually at the hour appointed, without some extraordinary reason.
- 3. To begin exactly at the hour, with singing or prayer.
- 4. To speak to each other in order, freely and plainly, with the true state of our souls.
- 5. To share our faults we committed in thought, word, or deed and the temptations we felt, since our last meeting.
- 6. To end every meeting with prayer as suited to the state of each person present.

Of course this arrangement was agreed upon by each person in the club and no one felt put upon to share such deep feelings and cares.

As members of Pleasant Green United Methodist Church we are charged to pray for one another and bear each other's burden. In writing to the church the Apostle James urges the members to confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another that you may be healed. The effective fervent prayer of a righteous person avails much. (James 5:16-17) Also Paul writes to the church at Galatia encouraging them to bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)

My friends, as part of the body of Christ we are called upon to help each other to be faithful to our yows of membership and to be accountable to our Christian witness. The vows we made to God standing before his people when we promised to serve God and his church with our gifts, talents, presence and witness; have not been forgotten. But many of us have not been faithful to that promise. Maybe we have wandered away to another congregation and no longer want to be affiliated with Pleasant Green United Methodist Church. Possibly we have moved away and commuting is not reasonable. Maybe we are sick and physical worship on location is not an option.

We want you to know that we love you here at Pleasant Green United Methodist Church. If you have not been attending for whatever reason; we want you to know we will be reaching out to you through our membership committee. We covenant to pray with you and help bear your burdens as we seek to serve God more faithfully in 2015.

#### **Ash Wednesday Service** Wednesday, February 18 ~ 7:00 pm ~ Chapel

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, a time when Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of 40 days of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. The service helps us to realize that both sin and death have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. During the service, Pastor Jesse will lightly rub the sign of the cross with ashes onto the foreheads of

worshipers. The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. Historically, ashes signified purification and sorrow for sins. The palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday service are burned to produce ashes. The ash cross on the forehead is an outward sign of our sorrow and repentance for sins.



#### **Backpack Ministry**

Last fall the family with 7 children, that we had been supporting moved out of Orange County. We were assigned another family in need. The head of this family is a single Dad, who works in a fast food restaurant in Hillsborough, and has 6 children. A girl 5 years old, a boy 7 years old, 2 boys in middle school ages 12 and 14, and 2 girls in high school ages 15 and 17. There are many ways to support our backpack family. Prayers, monetary gifts designated for the backpack program, gift cards for milk and juice from Food Lion or Walmart and food. Enough food for the weekend is delivered every Thursday. 2 Breakfasts - Cereal, breakfast bars, pop tarts, grits or oatmeal (we have plenty of oatmeal right now). 2 Lunches - Peanut butter and jelly, canned pasta like beefaroni, soup and crackers, chili, etc. 2 Dinners - Canned chicken, rice mixture, tuna and tuna helper, macaroni and cheese, ham, vegetables, Chicken and dumplings, spaghetti & sauce, beef stew, etc. Snacks - Rice crispie treats, granola bars, fruit snacks, ramen noodles, pudding, gelatin, fruit, cookies, etc. Check out the Backpack cart in the Narthex loaded with food for the weekend!


