



There is a small 93 page book called *Wonderful Names of Our Wonderful Lord*, printed in 2002 by Barbour Publishing. This gem was written by Charles E. Hurlburt and T.C. Horton. It is an abridged version of a larger volume. In it, there are different names and phrases for God that can stir our imagination and wonder: My Glory and The Lifter Up of My Head (Psalm 3.3); The Light of the Morning (2 Samuel 23:4); The Rock of My Salvation (2 Samuel 22:47); and Our Lawgiver (Isaiah 33:22) are just a few.




Join a Sunday School Class!

<u>Clyde Walker Class</u>: *The Jesus Revolution: Learning from Christ's First Followers* - Leith Anderson

The story of Jesus cannot be contained in a history of 33 years on an ancient strip of land along the eastern shore of the Mediterranean Sea. The group of 120 followers Jesus empowered transformed the world with the good news of redemption and reconciliation he preached. In this journey through the book of Acts, discover the leaps of faith taken by the early church to spread the news of the miracles they'd witnessed and the message they'd received. Their story carries us—his current followers—into our future. Their devotion and perseverance challenges us to step out in faith and make a difference in Jesus' name. We can experience Jesus' presence and power as the early church did, and be part of the ongoing movement to change the world with his revolutionary message.



Pastor Jesse's Class: The God We Can Know - Rob Fuquay



The God We Can Know is designed to explore the "I am" sayings of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. Perfect for Lent, this series will help you find and form an answer to the most essential question in the Christian faith, "Who do you say I am?" One by one, Jesus's statements grab our imagination, reveal more about his identity and purpose, and connect us to the God of Moses, who spoke the first "I am." These significant, yet ordinary images (bread, light, shepherd, vine, and more) give us insightful ways to experience Jesus and point us to a God who wants to be known. The DVD, in the Holy Land, allows you to see the places where Jesus stood while disclosing his true identity.

Women's Class: Twelve Women of the Bible - Lysa TerKuerst

This 12-session small group Bible study looks at the spiritual lessons learned from twelve biblical women and what they mean for your life today. Each session focuses on one biblical character (Rebekah, Abigail, Hannah, Gomer, Leah, Mary Magdalene, Mary of Bethany, Martha, The Woman at the Well, Mary the mother of Jesus, and The Syrophoenecian Woman). You'll learn about the triumphs and failures of Mary Magdalene, Rebekah, Hannah, and nine other women, studying their lives and learning how to apply biblical lessons to their own modernday struggles. You'll also discover lessons from each of these women that will help you persevere through the circumstances you are facing today.



Hearts & Hands Class: The Story of God, the Story of Us - Sean Gladding



Despite the warmth of the fire, he feels a chill. He wraps his cloak around him and looks into the eager faces of his people, then closes his eyes. 'Picture this scene . . . '" Before the Bible was a book, it was flesh and blood. In this book, you can travel with Sean Gladding between the lines of the Scriptures to listen in on the conversations of people wrestling with the Story of God for the first time. You'll encounter a tale that is at once familiar and surprising. The Story of God, the Story of Us can be read alone but is especially rich shared with a group. As much as the Bible is a story about God, it's also a story about you--and all of us--as we encounter God in a new way.

Join the Wednesday Morning 10:30 Bible Study

We live in a skeptical age. In this thoughtful eight week study Bishop Scott Jones, author of *The Wesleyan Way*, partners with his son Rev. Arthur Jones, to address hard questions that all of us face when considering faith, religion, and the church.

The questions include: Can only one religion be true? / Why is there suffering and evil? How can I believe in science and creation? / How can I believe in a God I can't prove? Can I trust the Old Testament? / Are marriage, sex, and family life religious issues? Was Jesus' resurrection real? / Why do Christians disagree about so many things? The message is strong and clear: Don't let your questions stop you from accepting God's invitation to faith. Engage your doubt, and you may find you are closer to God on the other side.
