The change in temperature, warm days, cooler evenings, and change in color of the leaves on the trees let us know that it's Autumn. I love autumn because it opens the door for some of the great holidays, such as Thanksgiving and Christmas. Without asking, I believe you would agree these are beautiful seasons. A changing season reminds us that everything changes.

The Bible informs us that in creation God placed the lights in the firmament of the heavens to divide the day from the night, and to let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and for years. (Genesis 1:14)

Yes, seasons come and seasons go. This is the way God planned it, because everything must change. In his book, Maximize the Moments, Bishop T.D. Jakes compares the stages of life with the seasons of the year. He has suggested, like infancy, Spring is the first season of life. It is the time of planting and growth and it is the time of accomplishment. It is, during this time, that which you need to build is flowing to you and through you. Summer, he says, is the season of blazing hot; an era in which you maintain what you have birthed. The infancy is over and this is the time of stability.

Autumn is the season of maturity. It is in this season that you are settled. You have produced your fruit. You have matured in many areas, and you now know what is expected and also how to cope with what you have to work with. You have adjusted your expectations and have benefited from the experiences; the knocks and bruises. This is the season of calmness. You are not easily rattled by life's challenges.

Winter, he says, is the season of rigidity. This is the season when ideas have become so formalized and traditions are maintained with passion because that is all that is familiar. All else is giving way to change and rebirth, as life prepares for the next generation of people, companies, and ideas. Winter is the season of life when we assess our accomplishments, enjoy our assets, pass on counsel, and take our bows.

Yes, in the end everything must change, because nothing stays the same. So we say, come on Autumn and Winter. We welcome you into our lives, with the changes that God will send.

She suggests that parents incorporate weekly gatherings into their family schedules for short periods 4 weeks at a time during 4 times of year: Advent, Lent, summer, and back-to-school.

used to do good work was uplifting.
