# "What then We say?"

In the text from Romans 8, which I have/will preach on July 26th and August 2<sup>nd</sup>, there is a great line written by the Apostle Paul that says this, "what then are we to say about these things?" What then are we to say? That's what I am wondering. What then shall I say? What then shall I preach? What then shall I write?

It's been 20 Sundays. Twenty Sundays since we have worshipped in person together and I never dreamed we would still be doing this at the beginning of August. And yet, here we are. What then are we to say, Paul wants to know. Perhaps we shall join the Psalmist in asking, "how long, O Lord?" Or the grumbling Israelites, "at least in Egypt we had our fill of bread!" Or Solomon's request for a wise and understanding mind to discern well. Or we can join Paul's proclamation, that "nothing in all creation shall separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Nothing. And so, we persist and we press on as the people of God – making disciples and doing what is within our power to transform the world.

I was very pleased to receive so many responses and feedback to the survey that I sent on Monday, July 20th. It helped me make some decisions about what we need to do (and not do) in the coming weeks. Thank you for taking time to do that and for your honesty in responding. Based on what I have learned and heard from you, I'd like to share what you can expect in the months of August and September.

Here's a look at what will continue:

- Online Worship each Sunday for the months of August and September
- DVD's of the service to provide for those who cannot access online services
- Wednesday morning gathering to read scripture, pray, and discussion readings via zoom
- Youth Zoom calls each Monday & Tuesday night
- Children's videos made available on the OCP Facebook page & website from July's monthlong Virtual VBS
- Sunday School classes meeting on Zoom
- Monthly Prayer Team call and letters sent
- Food contributions to OCIM and Food for All
- Weekly "Spiritual Care Package" with media, poetry and prayers sent each Sunday
- The numerous other ways we stay connected through phone calls, emails, & texts

Even as we continue our online worship, we will also start to "turn up the dimmer" on beginning some in-person gatherings in the next couple of months. Here's a look at what that will look like in August, and we will turn the dimmer up even more for the month of September (assuming things do not get worse).

A couple of women's circles have begun to have gatherings (social distancing and wearing masks) – If you feel safe gathering with a small group that has discontinued in this time, by all means, feel free to organize yourselves!

#### Faith in the Time of Loss

2 Corinthians 10:15 – We don't take pride in what other people do outside of our boundaries. We hope that our work will be extended even more by you as your faith grows, until it expands fully... (CEB).

3: 26 – For ye are all the children of God by faith in Jesus Christ (KJV).

Recently while listening to a news story on the radio, it became clear that many people are facing the loss of their homes, cars, food and medication security because they are running out of money with no hope for more in the near future. Words such as "frustrating," "scary," and "uncontrollable" were used by several people who were talking about their futures. In addition to these types of losses, many people have suffered the loss of relationships in some way over the past few months. These losses span a wide range, such as the loss of being with a loved one during death, loss of physical touching and hugging of grandchildren, loss of the comfort of gathering with family and friends. It is hard sometimes to imagine how we can overcome our sadness, despair, and grief when faced with this emptiness.

Yet, even if we can't pray for ourselves because we're so lonely and hurting, having faith that things will get better because Jesus Christ is with us and looking out for us, can get us through. The poem, <a href="Faith">Faith</a> by William Arthur Dunkerley, pen name for John Oxenham, may help us see some light.


