It Came Upon A Midnight Clear

I love this season of Advent and Christmas. I love the smells, the Christmas decorations, the baking of cakes, and all the bells and whistles of the season. I even love the rush of Christmas traffic and people hurrying to buy that Christmas gift for a family member or a friend.

However, more than all of these wonderful and exciting activities of Christmas, I love the church at worship during this season. I love the Advent and Christmas hymns. Hymns such as *O Holy Night*, *Joy to the World*, Away in a Manger, What Child is This; and one of my most favorite Christmas hymns, wait for it; It Came Upon A Midnight Clear.

This hymn describes the angels' announcement of Christ's birth to the shepherds, recorded in Luke chapter two; which describes the angels' appearance to the shepherds while they kept watch over their flock by night. I love this hymn and text because it suggests to us the tremendous responsibility that the shepherds and the image of shepherding would occupy in this new dispensation of God's Kingdom.

The image of the Lord as our Shepherd is an image that looms large in all of scripture, throughout the Old Testament, the Psalms, and the New Testament. The story of Abrahams' family tending their flock and David's writing in Psalm 23 are all placed so beautifully in scripture; informing us that God's desire is for us is to live a life of peace and prosperity. We need a shepherding spirit in politics, in business, in education and in religion. We need that shepherding spirit throughout the world to bring about the ways of peace and not war and destruction.

Because of all of the unrest in our world, we need to be reminded that *It Came Upon A Midnight Clear*. On the night of His birth there were no clouds in the sky, no storms on the horizon, and no rain in the forecast. It was a clear, bright and glorious night when Christ was born. It was a clear and glorious night; when the angels sang to the shepherds and to the world,

> Glory to God in the Highest and on earth; Peace to men on whom his favor rest.

Andrea Harris and Gail Pruett attended the 2nd Retreat of Project Bountiful on November 13th & 14th. The first day was information and inspiration filled. We heard the histories and stories of many of the churches participating in year two of the project (14 in all). Our presentation came on Saturday. For each church, we identified the bounties in that church and its values.

In some ways, Pleasant Green overlaps many other churches; in some ways we are unique. All of us are striving to live as closely to Jesus and His teachings as possible. Our mural will be posted for everyone to see very soon. Look for it!

Our focus for the history mural from Pleasant Green:

Many of the activities started in the distant past are still on-going today. Think stew, children's time during worship, United Methodist Women activities, caroling.

We are intentionally intergenerational in many of our activities (Clyde Walker Sunday School class, Common Thread, chicken and dumplings)

We value our children and youth, giving much attention and programming to them (Sunday School classes, Kids Worship, Children's Choir, Elevate, going to Pilgrimage and mission work).

We value service and mission work (Robeson County, Murdoch, El Salvador, Food for All)

PG is seen as a warm and welcoming church, striving to be family oriented.

During the process of creating the mural, we learned that in the 1960's and 1980's, there were many news articles about PG. This helped us have a stronger community presence. This knowledge may be helpful as we move forward.

We also heard more about the direction and focus for Project Bountiful (PB). Some of the important points:

Goal: moving from membership to discipleship focus in our approaches.

Foundational work for each church:

Identify our own values, vision and mission.

Context: our community, demographics, history, stories, values.

We are on a journey through a process. PB is not a one-time event.

We will develop our own Ministerial Action Plan (MAP) to guide us.

To accomplish change (from AA model): Relate, Repeat, Reframe our information and activities.

Partner with community groups and individuals to build relationships.

Reach out to the community to meet needs; provide service.

Explain our service to others in terms of "why" instead of what and how. For example, Wilber & Orville Wright often told others they were driven by the vision that the world would be a better place with air flight (their "why"). They were remembered, when competitors were not.

It is not important that everyone be on board with plans and changes. Instead, focus on innovators, early adopters, early majority (Diffusion of Innovation Theory).

"People don't care about what you know until they know you care." (Joel Ornstein). Caring can be a foundation for meeting community needs.

The Spiritual Web brings clarity to why individuals and the church as a whole approach their spirituality as they do. This web includes Head, Heart, Pilgrim, Mystic, Servant, Crusader approaches to spirituality...Look for more information in the future.

Next steps:

Discuss our values.

As a church, develop our vision. If we take a magic carpet ride over our church community in 5 years, what will we see? Collate the many visual pictures from church members > Condense the ideas to 1 to 2 pages > Collapse to one memorable line.

Once our vision is developed, re-visit our mission statement.

This is an exciting time, with excellent guidance from the Project Bountiful leadership and resources. Andrea and Gail hope you get the PB bug as we have!

From PG November 2006 Newsletter... A community of gift we call Church

Imagine receiving an unexpected gift from an acquaintance. What is your first thought? "Oh, she shouldn't have!" And then, "Darn it! Now I have to give *her* something!" It is aggravating to feel indebted to someone else, isn't it? "Until I give something to her, she can hold this over my head...."

Now imagine Jesus hanging on the cross, his mother and one of his disciples are standing there. John tells us that "When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, 'Woman, here is your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home." (John 19:26-27)


As God spoke creation into being, with these few words from the cross Jesus enacts a new community, he begins a new politics, a politics of gift. "Here is your son... here is your mother." This is the new politics we call Church, where mothers who have lost sons and young men who have lost friends find one another.

What could John the disciple and Mary the mother of God give to Jesus in return for his sacrifice? Nothing. And so it is with us. We can give nothing to God that is not already God's. Unlike the acquaintance who expects a gift in return, God needs nothing from us; he does not *need* our help. God will be God regardless of what we do or do not do. Yet God has invited us to participate in this community of gift. The latest opportunity for such participation here at Pleasant Green comes in the form of hurricane relief. Many of you have already given to UMCOR and to other similar efforts; thanks be to God for your gift. The relief work continues, however. Donna and I will be leading a mission team to Gulfport, Mississippi, over Thanksgiving weekend. The youth group will be making a similar trip next summer. You are invited to participate. Please join us for one of these trips. Consider an offering of money or supplies to assist these relief efforts.

We, like John and Mary, stand at the foot of the cross alongside those who have lost so much because of these recent hurricanes. From the cross Christ beckons us to participate in God's new community. On the cross Jesus gives us the greatest gift of all, and in giving John and Mary one to the other, he teaches us how to give. The truth about a gift is that it is freely given, without cost to the one who receives it. So we do not give out of obligation, but rather out of thanksgiving. For through Christ, God has already enacted a new politics, a community of gift we call Church. In giving, we reflect this new creation and boldly proclaim that Christ has come, and will come again.


Join an Advent Sunday School Study!



Seekers: Journey with Adam Hamilton as he travels from Nazareth to Bethlehem in this fascinating look at the birth of Jesus Christ. This five-session DVD was filmed in the Holy Land and is a companion resource to *The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem* church program. Each exciting session contains 10-15 minute video vignettes of Adam Hamilton retracing the actual path of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. Also includes a bonus segment on the Holy Land today.

Hearts & Hands: Imagine Jesus from Mary's point-of-view—proud of her son, in awe of his gifts and mission, guided by love for him as a person and so much more.
