STICKY FAITH: WHAT MAKES FAITH "STICK" WITH CHILDREN AND YOUTH?

About this time every year, Pleasant Green experiences transition. Duke Interns graduate and move on and for our church that means — a change in leadership with our children and youth. And anytime there is a transition, we are invited into a season of reflection and visioning. For us at PG, it happens each year — around April, May, and June. Emily has been serving alongside our young people for the past two years and now we will bless her as she returns to her home Conference in Western NC and lead a two-point charge as a solo pastor. Meanwhile, we will turn our attentions to "what's next" for our children and youth?

As we have sought to answer that question, other conversations always seem to surface: Who do we hire? What would a job description look like? Where is there energy? Why aren't youth in worship? While there may be a time and place for these questions, I wonder what it would look like to ask better questions: How do we live into our baptism vows to nurture one another in faith? And how to we form the faith of our youth in such a way that sticks after they graduate? How do we engage in faith formation that is effective and lasting beyond the years they are entrusted in our care?

The Fuller Youth Institute conducted research (which is perhaps a bit outdated, but I'm sure the numbers aren't better today than they were ten years ago) and found that 40-50% of kids who are part of a youth group in high school faith to stick with their faith in college. They proceeded to spend the next six years (2004-2010) to conduct studies, research and interviews to find out why. The result of those findings are found in the book Sticky Faith: Practical Ideas to Nurture Long-Term Faith in Teenagers.

In their book, they define sticky faith as faith that is "part of a student's inner thoughts and emotions and is also externalized in choices and actions that reflect this faith commitment." The authors (Kara Powell, Brad Griffin, and Cheryl Crawford) wrote an entire book on this topic, but are there a few key findings that may help us in this season of transition? Yes, I think there are! Ministries that foster sticky faith...

1. are Intergenerational

Young faith grows best in a web of support (including parents!). It is crucial for anyone seeking maturity in a faith journey to be surrounded by people who are more mature in the faith, which leads us to #3.

2. Invert the Ratio

Typically in youth/children ministry, we say we need one adult to every 5 children (or 2 adults total to meet Safe Sanctuary). Instead of 1:5, it is important for kids to be able to identify 5 adults invested in their life (ratio 5:1).

3. Include Worship

In worship, people encounter the living God. They are immersed in liturgy, hearing the language of faith and they are surrounded by intergenerational relationships. Research found a deep connection between regular church-wide worship and sticky faith. (Note: the goal is not church membership. The goal is making disciples of Jesus who seek justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God).

4. Decentralize Leadership

There has been a tendency in the last few decades to leave youth ministry to the "hired professional." Congregations, not gifted youth pastors, are key to effectiveness and sustainability.

5. Most importantly, are centered on Christ.

In attempts to make ministry "cool" and "entertaining" and to compete with other community offerings, we have too often failed at faith formation. In attempts to be "relevant" and talk about topics like friendships, sex and alcohol, we have rarely focused on Jesus. In hopes of getting kids to live a particularly kind of lifestyle, we have failed to cultivate a lifelong relationship with God. Sticky faith is centered on Christ.

While this list is certainly not exhaustive or allinclusive, it is a start to helping us consider how to foster the young ones in our midst. Disciples make disciples who make disciples. May we embrace our calling to make disciples of all ages right here at Pleasant Green UMC.

IT BEGAN IN A CORNFIELD - EL SALVADOR MISSION TRIP

For the past 15 + years, Pleasant Green has had a fruitful partnership with the Methodist Church in El Salvador. Our work began in the small village of La Providencia, just outside of Ahuachapan, where our first mission was to provide medical care to that community and building a home for Angelita (an elderly woman in the community).

During that first trip, a vision was cast that a Methodist church was needed for the community. A small parcel of land, nothing but a field of corn at a dirt crossroad, was identified as the perfect spot for the church. Over the course of the following year, Pleasant Green raised the funds for the purchase of that field of corn and now, years later, that parcel holds a thriving church, a parsonage, an education hall and a medical clinic! It thrills this writer's soul to see how a simple vision can become a possibility and then a vital reality for a community a world away. And it is all because of your faithful generosity.

In the ensuing years our mission teams have helped to build schools, churches and homes. We've delivered countless meal packages to hungry homes and taught hundreds of children about the love of Jesus. A PRAYER FOR THE HOLY SPIRIT AS WE CELEBRATE PENTECOST

"I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever."

John 14:16

As we approach Pentecost Sunday on May 28th, seven Sundays after Easter, we have a lot to be thankful for. While the Holy Spirit was part of the Holy Trinity (God, Jesus, Holy Spirit) from the beginning of time and through the time Jesus was on earth; Pentecost is the day when Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to dwell within the Disciples, and consequently, dwell within us. The Spirit provided strength, direction, support, and comfort to the Disciples after Jesus ascended into heaven; giving them powerful insight into the mysteries of Jesus' teachings, allowing the disciples to preach Jesus' Word with confidence. It is through The Holy Spirit that the Christian Church was started, as described in the Book of ACTS. All of that is a gift to us as well, as we are God's children and Jesus' followers.

The first Pentecost took place so long ago! How does that apply to us today? The Holy Spirit is alive and active, speaking to us in different ways. My personal experience is that the Holy Spirit talks to me a lot, in a thought, a shift in mood or attention, a creative idea, in silence; the silence indicating that I do not have God's blessing to start a new project or do something I wondered about doing. It is the Spirit that guides me on what to write for this column, what ministries to volunteer for, who to reach out to with a card or email, who and what to pray for. It is the Spirit who helps me remember that Jesus is always with me, even during tough times. And it is the Spirit who directs me on changes God is molding within me, from an angry, sarcastic person to one who strives to be gentle and kind; from a fearful, anxious person to one who is peaceful and calm; from an impatient person to one who can wait on God's answers.

It took years of practice and intention to listen to the Holy Spirit, discerning the Spirits' will above my own. Our Clyde Walker Sunday School Class had talked about being discerning of God's will through the Holy Spirit many times. Through those discussions and God's Word, I finally came to this in my own life: if the idea or message from the Holy Spirit advanced God's kingdom on earth, helped to do something good for someone, or gave me direction on some project the Spirit wants me to do, it was a message from God. Then, when I used what the Spirit was telling me, such as calling a church member, suggesting a new ministry, or speaking to a stranger, and there was a positive reaction, I began to trust that it was the Holy Spirit who had guided me. I don't always get it right. The important thing is to begin; especially begin by praying the Holy Spirit will guide you, and that you will listen! I always thank the Holy Spirit for any guidance, comfort; whatever the Spirit provides.

Let us pray: Holy Spirit, You are God. I praise you because you are holy, and I thank you for dwelling in my heart. Thank you for working in my life. You guided me into salvation, renewed my dead spirit, and you opened my eyes to the Truth. Thank you.

Help me to see you more clearly – to recognize your movement in my life. Make me more sensitive to you so I can follow you more closely. Still, I know that I am selfish and rebellious. I need you to help me be obedient when I recognize your leading. I need you.

I ask you for your help and comfort today. You know my pain and anxieties very well. Thank you for praying over me. Help me to rest in your comfort today.

Help me to walk in you, the Spirit of God. Grow good fruit in my life. You are the one who produces these in me: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. I cannot live out these things on my own; I need you.
