### Let's Go to Bethlehem!

Virtually – of course. Because, it's still 2020.

During Advent this year, the congregations of the Orange Cooperative Parish would like to go on a journey together, with Mary and Joseph -- to Bethlehem. From Hillsborough, NC to Bethlehem, Israel it is approximately 6,100 miles. We would like to travel those miles together. Whether you walk, bike, run or skip we hope you will go with us.

How will this work? As you go about your daily life, exercising as you normally do, track your miles. We have created an online "tracker" where you can enter those miles. By Epiphany, our goal is, as a Parish, to have exercised 6,100 miles together (but apart)—enough to get us to the Holy City for the birth of Christ.

Our goal is twofold: Winter is hard and we will still be in a pandemic. We hope that this will be motivation to get out and get moving (collectively)! We want to encourage a healthy lifestyle in all the ways we can. Secondly, we want to live into our vision to be a missional people by raising money to help one particular organization, The Compass Center for Women and Families (located in Chapel Hill) whose work is especially important in the midst of this pandemic.

We have chosen this organization because the COVID-19 pandemic has put a spotlight on numerous ongoing health crises, including housing and violence within the home. We recognize that this pandemic has brought it with it many other stresses for people's personal lives, and, as a faith community, it is our calling to stand and support the vulnerable. Take a minute to google these two organizations and learn more about the important work they do in our local communities.

Our goal is to raise \$1/mile. You can raise this however you want - personally contribute or ask others to sponsor you. If you go 20 miles, we hope you will donate \$20 or have someone donate on your behalf. If you go 100, even better!

#### How to join the journey:

I will share a link by email, Facebook, and on our website. Simply click the click and follow the instructions to join the challenge! After you run, walk or skip, head on over to the link (Challenge Hound) and enter your mileage! The link is live and you can join anytime! The challenge itself will begin on the first Sunday of Advent (November 29). You can join the challenge anytime, but no new participants may join after December 5. I will also be sharing a separate link where we will collect donations, so keep your eyes and ears out for that too!

One of my favorite African proverbs is this: "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together." Bethlehem is a long ways away. So whether you can contribute 5 miles or 50, your miles (and dollars) will help! I believe that -together – we can reach this goal. I also believe, that, together, we can be a light and blessing to our neighbors this season.



Known also as "Blue Christmas," a Longest Night Gathering is a safe and sacred space to share anguish, to plead with God to remember us, to pray for justice and restoration, even to hope against hope, through our doubts and tears and fears, that "God will set things right all over the earth." We have chosen to gather at Camp in order to have a very large area and gather safely and practice social-distancing.

#### "Now Thank We All Our God" - A PANDEMIC PERSPECTIVE

One Monday in October I listened to parts of a National Council of Churches online conference on the theme of "Breathing New Life into our Nation." The first three speakers all had NC connections. The keynote speaker was James Forbes, former pastor of Riverside Church in New York City, who was born in Burgaw, NC and whose father was a pastor in Raleigh. The responders were Chanequa Walker-Barnes, one of the former student interns at PGUMC, now a professor at Mercer University in Atlanta and Jonathan Wilson Hartgrove, a pastor and writer who is the leader of an intentional community in Durham. The fact that I noted – and appreciated – their NC connections is because of my changed perspectives. Years ago we were living in Philadelphia when Dennis called me while on a trip in North Carolina and asked if I would be willing to move to North Carolina so he could accept an appealing job offer; my response was to tell him that wasn't a very funny joke and the answer was NO.

Changing our perceptions based on our changing experiences is something we have all been learning during this pandemic. We have all had to establish priorities. We wear masks not because we like them or think they are attractive, but because we want to protect others. If eating out was a great pleasure in the past, we've learned to appreciate take-out or the fun of trying out new recipes at home.

The pandemic has forced us to realize we miss some things we took for granted before. Instead of passing the beautiful collection plates that Mike Martin made when the sanctuary was built, we give our tithes and offerings on-line or by mail or by slipping an envelope under the church office door. We realize now how visionary Billy Totten was when he avoided hugging or shaking hands during the passing of the peace in worship services. And we suspect that passing the peace will never be done in quite the same way even once it is safe to again gather in the sanctuary or chapel for worship services. And yet the congregation has continued to have worship every week and we have continued to support the church budget.

One change of perspective is to focus on what blessings we still enjoy rather than complaining about what is lost from our lives. Before the pandemic, there may have been times when we were so involved with a variety of distractions that we didn't hear the quiet voice of God speaking to us. But during times of stress and anxiety, we are more prone to seek God's presence.

The Lutheran pastor Martin Rinkart lived during the 30 Year War in Europe and a severe plague in the 1630s. There was a period when he was the only surviving pastor in his community, sometimes conducting as many as 50 funerals a day. In the year in which his own wife died, he performed more than 4000 funerals. And yet that same pastor wrote the words to the hymn "Now Thank We All Our God" p. 102 in the United Methodist Hymnal. When we consider the difficult times in which he lived, we recognize that is only through his abiding faith that he would write:

Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, who wondrous things has done, in whom this world rejoices. who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.

O may this bounteous God, through all our life be near us, With ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us; And keep us still in grace, and guide us when perplexed, And free us from all ills, in this world and the next.


